5. Exhibits of Flowers, Fruit and Vegetables **must be the produce of the Exhibitor's own garden, unless otherwise stated.**
6. Exhibits of Cookery and Preserves are to be the unaided work of the Exhibitor.
7. All exhibits must be staged between 9 am - 10.30 am on Saturday 5 September, after which the hall will be cleared for judging.
8. The Committee cannot be held responsible for any entry lost or damaged.
9. Entrance fees:- All adult and children's classes – 50p per entry.
10. We regret that **NO NEW ENTRIES** can be accepted on the day. **Please ensure you have correctly entered the categories on your application form. Errors cannot be rectified on the day.**
11. The decision of the judges shall be final.
